Our Mission

Camp Milton's purpose is to create a community of empowerment and belonging for children and young adults with neuromuscular diseases.

This summer camp is more than just a week of fun. Camp Milton gives kids freedom from the limitations they have to endure the other 51 weeks of the year...



This special weeklong camp started over 60 years ago. But in 2018, amidst the change in funding, the camp's name officially became Camp Milton with a new generation of volunteers taking the reigns in order to continue the local camp traditions. It allowed families to remain in their same support system that they were so comfortable trusting their kids in. With some fundraising and access to other local resources, we tested the waters with a Labor Day Weekend Retreat in 2018. And with the support of our dedicated sponsors, the first full week of camp was in June of 2019, an absolute success by all measures, and we look forward to keeping Camp Milton on the calendar every year in the month of June.

In order to understand the importance of this camp, it needs to be witnessed through the eyes of a child who suffers from one of these debilitating diseases. They are told 51 weeks of the year what they can't do, due to their limited mobility. When they are greeted by their counselor at Camp Milton, they are told they can do anything. They get to swim, fish, shoot archery and do so many other daily activities. Plus there are arts and crafts, a talent show and even a dance! But the most important aspect of Camp Milton is they get to be with kids just like them! They develop life-long relationships and build self-confidence and independence in ways they never thought possible.

This weeklong summer camp is offered at no charge to families, thanks to all of our donors and sponsors. It is available to children ages 6 to 18 who suffer from neuromuscular diseases. All activities are wheelchair accessible so no child is left out of the fun.

Milton the Moose - Camp Mascot & Adventurer



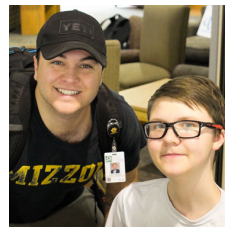

Tall Oaks Conference Center Linwood, Kansas

Camp Milton is free to any family with a child between the ages of 6 to 18 who lives with a neuromuscular disease.

- The Tall Oaks Conference Center is an ACA accredited camp that can accommodate 90 campers with their counselors.
- Seven cabins are available for use – each camper is placed by gender and age in handicap-accessible cabins.
- A dedicated volunteer nursing staff and pharmacy techs are on hand 24/7 to administer medications and for all other medical needs of our campers.
- Three healthy meals are served in the cafeteria each day. Dietary restrictions are monitored closely by the dedicated cooking staff and nurses.
- The cost for one child to attend the full week of summer camp is approximately \$2000.00.
- Arts & crafts, swimming, archery, and fishing are some of the activities available to all our campers. We also plan special themed activities everyday so our campers spend time developing close friendships with their cabin mates. All activities are handicap accessible so all the kids are able to participate.
- A large number of our counselors have volunteered at this camp for several years, so they are well-versed on the rules and diligent care required for campers no matter the severity of their disabilities.
- Any child, ages 6 to 18 in the state of Kansas or Missouri who suffers from a neuromuscular disease can attend our week-long camp free of charge thanks to the generosity of our sponsors.
- Camp Milton's purpose is to give these kids an outlet from their daily struggles by encouraging them that anything is possible at camp. The volunteer's motto is never say "no". When a camper wants to try an activity or use their creativity on a project, we will do everything we can to make it possible.

Who is Milton?

So, wondering how Camp Milton's name sake came about? Well, we could go through his whole family tree, but we won't bore you.

It all started back in 2006.....

Milton was born June 15, 2006. As a camp activity, some talented wood carvers came out to visit. They brought a couple of pre-carved items and then carved additional statues for the campers to view that day. They ended up having enough statues to have one represent each cabin, including a moose.

Later, at our traditional bonfire, we decided to assign each cabin their own "mascot". But with one catch... in order to get the mascot they wanted they had to bribe the staff. The moose, Milton, was the most popular and the one everyone was rooting for. We gave them 24 hours to come up with their best bribes.

Well, that night some of the older boys decided they were just going to take the one they wanted, so they stole Milton and hid him. But they didn't hide him very well - during bed checks that night, he was found under an end table in the boys' cabin! So the staff took him, and spent the evening taking pictures of him all over camp, on the diving board, in the nurse's office, on the toilet, etc. The staff printed the photos out and displayed them for the campers to show where "Milton" had been all night! This was the beginning of taking Milton and hiding him and holding him for ransom. Now, at camp (and all year long) he is kidnapped and taken on different adventures, but there must always be photos to document his antics!
